








Make A Moon Phase Garland

Put them in order:












Draw A Stained Glass Window

Here are some examples to help you get started:












Shadow Tracing

Questions To Ask A Child About The Wheel of the Year

Want to start an engaging discussion about the eight pagan festivals and how you celebrate them?

Here are some conversation starters for you!

- Selene and Gaia celebrate a lot of holidays in this story. What's your favourite holiday, and what traditions do your family have when celebrating it?
- 2. At Yule, it's common to give presents. What's the best gift you've ever received?
- 3. Imbolc represents the return of the sun! How do you feel when the days start getting longer? And when the sun stays out for longer?
- 4. Selene and Gaia host a banquet to celebrate Lugnasa
 if you could host a feast, what food would you serve?
- 5. Lammas celebrates sharing! What's something you love to share and what's something you could share more of with others?
- 6. Which different colours do you see the most during autumn time? What one is your favourite?
